Vietri sul Mare ("on the Sea") is a village near Salerno, in the Campania Region of Southern Italy. It is a popular tourist destination and it is a convenient place to visit the Amalfi Coast. The inhabitants call it "The First Pearl of the Coast," claiming that the Amalfi coast begins there. Vietri is popular also for the production of ceramics (dishes, flowerpots, vases and tiles) that can be found in restaurants, hotels and homes throughout the Amalfi area. Moreover, Vietri is a convenient starting-point to visit the archeological sites of Pompeii and Haerculaneum.

The number of participants is limited to 40. Candidates will be selected based on their CVs, on their academic qualifications and on their publication record. Applications must be sent by **28 February**.

Selected participants will be advised by March 15 and will have to register by April 13.
